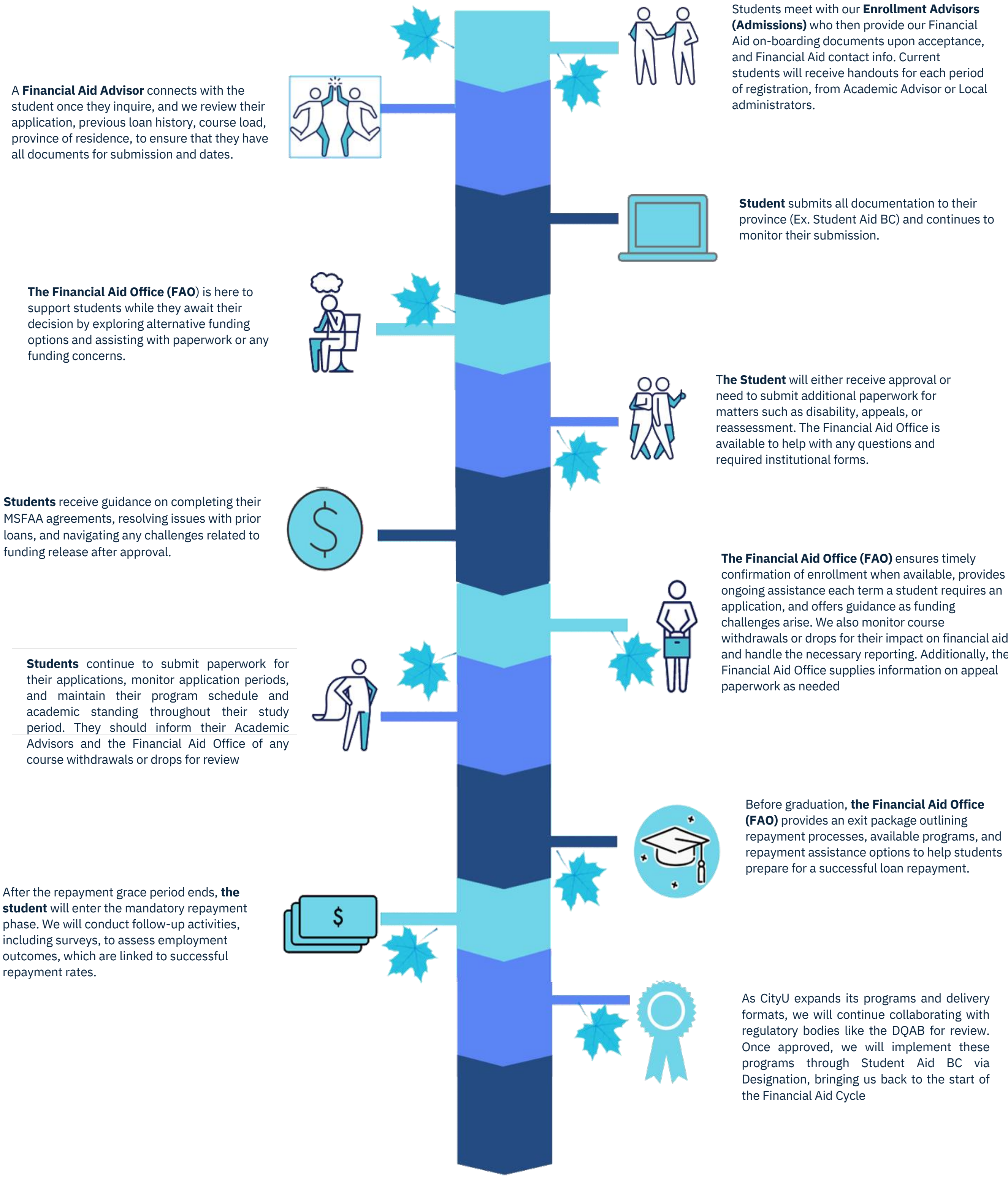

Financial Aid Pocketbook and Guide

Getting Started at CityU

Q: What are grants and loans? A: Grants are non-repayable amounts, while loans are repayable amounts that you must repay with interest (depending on the province) after you graduate. One application will assess you for both grants and loans.

Q: What is the Financial Aid calendar and when do I need to apply? A: Each province has different deadlines for Financial Aid applications. Ideally, CityU prefers applications to be submitted by the following deadlines to allow sufficient review time:

- **Winter Term (Jan 1 - Mar 31):** Apply in November - December of the previous year
- **Spring Term (Apr 1 - Jun 30):** Apply in February - March
- **Summer Term (Jul 1 - Sep 30):** Apply in May - June
- **Fall Term (Oct 1 - Dec 31):** Apply in August - September

Q: What is considered full-time studies? A:

- **BC Residents:** Enrolled in at least 60% of a full-time course load (minimum of 12 credits per term). Students with a recognized permanent disability must be enrolled in at least 40% of a full-time course load (minimum of 6-8 credits per term).
- **AB and Other Provinces’ Residents:** Enrolled in at least 60% of a full-time course load (minimum of 5 credits per term).

Q: What is considered part-time studies? A:

- **BC Residents:** Enrolled in 6-8 credits per term.
- **AB and Other Provinces’ Residents:** Enrolled in at least 3 credits per term.

Which Programs are Eligible?

- **BC Residents:** Eligible for MC (Master of Counselling) full-time, Saturday, and mix-mode cohorts. **MED School Counselling and MED Leadership programs are not eligible.**
- **AB Residents:** Eligible for MC full-time, weekend, mix-mode, and virtual cohorts. MED Leadership is eligible.

Q: How do I submit any paperwork for review? A: Our office can efficiently process all paperwork with digital signatures and seals, provided that students submit their documents in a timely manner. Please email FinAidCanada@cityu.edu for any document processing requests.

How to Apply

Q: How can I apply for Financial Aid? A: Follow our checklist to apply for Financial Aid, specific to your province:

Q: What is the frequency of applying for Financial Aid? A:

- **Full-time students:** Apply every 6 months in the 1st year, and every 12 months in the 2nd and 3rd years.
- **BC Students with disability status:** Apply every 6 months.
- **Part-time students:** Apply every 6 months.

Q: What if my application goes missing? A: Keep a copy of all submitted documents and confirmation emails. If your application goes missing, contact the Financial Aid Office immediately with your copies as proof of submission.

Q: What do I do if I can't reach Student Aid? A: If you have trouble reaching Student Aid, try multiple contact methods including phone, email, and visiting their website for updates. **Q: What if I havent heard back in a few days from the CityU Financial Aid Office? A:** Follow up with an email

, or phone call to ensure your query is being processed. High volume periods might delay responses.

The Decision

Q: What happens if my application is approved? A: You will receive an approval letter detailing the amount and terms of your Financial Aid. Complete the required agreements (e.g., MSFAA) to finalize the process.

Q: What if additional documentation is requested? A: Submit any additional documentation promptly. The Financial Aid Office can help you understand and gather the required information.

Q: How long does it take to get a decision? A: Processing times can vary, but aim to apply at least two months before your program starts to allow ample time for processing.

Paying the School

Q: What is a Deferral of Payment Request and how do I submit one? A: Deferrals are permitted until funding is released for students with approved Financial Aid. Once your funding is released, please make sure to pay for your school costs as soon as possible. Financial aid funding is processed and sent directly to your personal bank account, and you are responsible for making payments to the school. To request a deferral, please email a copy of your approval letter along with your request, including your student ID and full name, to FinAidCanada@cityu.edu and billing@cityu.edu. Deferral requests are processed in the order they are received. For exceptions, please contact billing@cityu.edu. If you do not have an award letter but have submitted your application, or if you need a deferral before submitting an application, reach out to billing@cityu.edu to discuss your options and cc: FinAidCanada@cityu.edu.

6-month Financial Aid applications: Pay Quarter 1 with the 1st disbursement and Quarter 2 with the 2nd disbursement. **One-year Financial Aid applications:** Pay for Quarter 1 and Quarter 2 from the first disbursement. Pay for Quarter 3 and Quarter 4 from the second disbursement.

Review your award amounts, disbursement dates, school costs, and budgets to distribute your funding evenly for each term. Contact the Billing Office for more information on Deferrals: billing@cityu.edu

Avoiding Repayment While in School

Q: When do I need to repay my loans and at what interest rate? A: Repayment terms vary by province:

- **BC:** You begin repayment six months after your study period concludes. As of April 1, 2023, interest on Canada Student Loans has been eliminated.
- **AB:** Start repaying 12 months after leaving school. Loans are interest-free while studying and during the 12-month grace period. **Ontario:** Repayment starts six months after the study period ends.

Q: What if I face difficulties repaying my loan? A: Reach out to the Financial Aid Office for guidance on repayment assistance programs and strategies to manage your debt.

Q: How will the Financial Aid Office follow up after graduation? A: The office will gently reach out for follow-ups and surveys to understand your employment success and repayment rates, offering support whenever you need it.

Managing Your Loan

- **Confirmation of Enrollment:** Make sure your enrollment is confirmed with the National Student Loans Service Centre (NSLSC) to avoid your loan entering repayment early.
- **Staying Out of Repayment:** If you resume full-time studies after beginning repayment, apply for in-study interest-free status to pause payments during your studies.
- **Repayment Assistance Plan (RAP):** If you're struggling with payments, consider applying for the Repayment Assistance Plan (RAP), which adjusts payments to be affordable based on your income and family size. Remember to reapply every six months to remain on the plan.

City University in Canada is committed to providing accessible and inclusive education for all those with the desire to learn. We currently offer several scholarships for students studying in Canada, based on financial need and other criteria. Applications are required for each application period to be considered. Students must be enrolled to receive the award and meet other eligibility criteria. Explore our scholarship offerings below!

Need-Based Scholarships - General and Indigenous

CityU Need-Based Scholarship

Eligibility: Available to both new students enrolling at CityU and current students.

Purpose: This scholarship is designated for tuition during the award period only and is granted based on financial need.

Award Details: Varies per quarter and academic year.

How to Apply: <https://cityuniversity.ca/admissions/scholarships/>

1. Choose and complete the appropriate Need-Based Scholarship application.
2. Submit an essay answering the questions from the application.
3. Canadian students must provide their current tax assessment for the specified year by the application deadline. (T4's are not a valid substitute for the tax assessment).

Canadian students must submit their current tax assessment for the required year on or before the application deadline (T4s are not a valid substitute for the tax assessment).

Indigenous Scholarships

Indigenous Student Tuition Reduction Grant

Eligibility: All Canadian First Nations, Métis, and Inuit students enrolled in any City University in Canada degree-granting program.

Award Details: 25% of the quarterly tuition will be covered each term for the duration of studies at CityU, as long as the student remains in good academic standing. Grant funds apply exclusively to CityU tuition, cannot be used for fees, and are non-refundable. No reapplication is necessary each quarter.

Requirements: Maintain a minimum of a 2.0 quarter GPA and active status with the university.

Investing in Indigenous Scholars Scholarship

Eligibility: First Nations, Métis, and Inuit students who demonstrate financial need and are first-time applicants to a City University in Canada degree-granting program.

Award Details: This need-based scholarship covers 100% of tuition for the entire degree program, provided the student maintains good academic standing. Scholarship funds apply solely to CityU tuition and are non-refundable.

Emergency Grant

CityU Emergency Grant

Eligibility: Open to current full-time or part-time students experiencing unforeseen financial hardships. Applicants must demonstrate financial need due to emergencies such as medical expenses, loss of income, natural disasters, or other urgent financial situations.

Purpose: Provide immediate financial assistance to ensure students can continue their studies without interruption.

How to Apply:

1. Contact the CityU Financial Aid Office to discuss your situation and obtain the necessary application forms.
2. Complete the application form, providing detailed information about your financial emergency and including all required documentation.
3. Submit the completed application form and supporting documents to the Financial Aid Office. The Financial Aid Office will evaluate your application and provide a decision within 10 business days. If approved, the emergency grant funds will be disbursed to cover the immediate financial needs specified in your application.

Repayment for Student Loans in Canada

General Information

Repaying your student loans is an essential part of managing your financial future after completing your studies. Understanding the repayment process and the support available can help you navigate this phase smoothly.

How Repayment Works

1. **Six-Month Non-Repayment Period:** After completing your studies, you will enter a six-month non-repayment grace period. During this time, you are not required to make payments, although interest may continue to accrue based on your province and loan type.
- 2 **Starting Repayment:** Repayment begins at the end of the six-month non-repayment period. You will receive a package detailing your payment terms and options.
- 3 **Making Payments:** Payments can be made through pre-authorized debit, online banking, or directly through your NSLSC account. It's important to make payments consistently to avoid negative impacts on your credit rating.
Repayment Assistance Plan (RAP): If you have trouble making payments, you can apply for the Repayment Assistance Plan (RAP). This plan helps make your payments affordable based on your income and family size. You need to reapply every six months to stay on the plan(NSLSC)([Canada.ca](https://www.canada.ca)).

BC Residents: StudentAid BC Guide

Introduction StudentAid BC provides financial assistance to eligible students to help cover the costs of post-secondary education. This guide will walk you through the steps to apply for funding, eligibility criteria, and important deadlines.

Steps to Apply for StudentAid BC : City U Checklists

1. **Create an Account**
Action: Use the BC Services Card app to create a StudentAid BC account. This digital ID will allow you to access the student loan application via the StudentAid BC Dashboard.

2. **Choose Your School and Study Period**
Action: Select the post-secondary school you plan to attend and determine the registration period for which you need funding. In this instance, please select City University.
3. **Determine Your Financial Need**
Action: Calculate how much money you need and complete a budget [worksheet](#).
4. **Submit Your Application**
Action: Log in to the StudentAid BC Dashboard with your BC Services Card app, complete, and submit the online application. Ensure you read and agree to the terms and conditions, including the CRA Consent for income verification.

5. **Check Your Application Status**
Action: Monitor the status of your application through your dashboard. StudentAid BC typically processes applications within six weeks.

Application Deadlines

- **Earliest Application Date:** Applications for the upcoming program year are available in early June.
- **Latest Application Date:** Apply no later than six weeks before your study program ends, ensuring all required documentation is submitted.

Receiving Your Funding

- **Notification of Assessment:** After assessment, you will receive a notification detailing how much funding you will get.
- **Disbursement:** Follow the steps provided to use your funding to pay for school. Ensure your school confirms your enrollment to release the funds.

Maintaining Your Loan

6. In-Study Payment-Free Status

Action: Apply to maintain your in-study interest-free status to avoid entering repayment while still studying.

Indigenous Student Funding and Support Process

CityU in Canada provides dedicated support for Indigenous students seeking funding through Band or community-based sponsorships. Follow the steps below to coordinate your funding:

1. **Contact the Financial Aid Office:** Reach out to our Financial Aid Office to request a Place Holder letter or get in contact with your Indigenous community representative for funding purposes.
2. **Coordinate with the Billing Office:** In the same email, include our Billing Office at billing@cityu.edu and advise them of the need to set up third-party billing and invoicing for your sponsor.
3. **Receive Place Holder Letter or Communication:** The Financial Aid Office will send a Place Holder letter or communication to your sponsor, outlining the timeline around registration and providing contact information for further inquiries.
4. **Set Up Third-Party Billing:** The Billing Office will set up the process to accept funding directly from your Band or community sponsor.

Request Confirmation of Registration: Be aware that any Confirmation of Registration from the Registrar's Office will only be available after registration is completed.

Third-Party Billing Process for External Scholarships and Private Sponsors

Purpose:

This process outlines the steps for Indigenous students at CityU to have their tuition and fees billed directly to a third-party payer. It aims to facilitate financial support for Indigenous students at CityU, ensuring a smooth billing experience while respecting the terms set by third-party funding organizations., such as an Indigenous community or organization, in support of their educational funding.

1. Eligibility Confirmation

- Students must confirm eligibility for third-party funding through their Indigenous community or organization prior to enrolling at CityU.
- A copy of the funding agreement or letter from the third-party payer should be submitted to the Business Office at Billing@cityu.edu

2. Submission of Required Documentation

- Students must submit a Third-Party Billing Agreement Form or Letter that includes:
 - o The student's full name and ID number.
 - o Details of the third-party payer (organization name, contact person (phone and email), and billing address).
 - o A copy of the funding agreement from the third-party payer.

3. Enrollment Confirmation

- Once enrolled, students must provide proof of enrollment (i.e., a confirmation letter from CityU) to the third-party payer, ensuring they understand their financial responsibility and the payment terms.

1. Billing Process

- After the completion of registration, the CityU Business Office generates a billing statement detailing:
 - o Tuition and fees for the upcoming term.
 - o Any applicable grants or scholarships.
 - o The statement is sent to the third-party payer for processing.

2.Payment Arrangements

- The third-party payer must complete payment arrangements with CityU according to their policies and procedures.
- Payments should be made in full or as outlined in the funding agreement.

3.Notification of Payment

- Once payment is received, the Business Office will notify the student and confirm that their account is settled for the term.
- If the third-party payer delays or declines payment, the student is responsible for settling any outstanding balance with CityU.

4.Regular Updates

- Students should maintain regular communication with both the Business Office and their third-party payer to ensure that all documentation is current, and payments are processed in a timely manner.

5.Reassessing Funding

- If changes occur in the student's status or in the funding agreement, students must promptly inform the Business Office and the third-party payer to reassess funding eligibility and arrangements.

6.Completion of Studies

- Upon completion of their program, students may request a statement of account from the Business Office for their records and for any potential follow-up with the third-party payer regarding outstanding payments or funding.

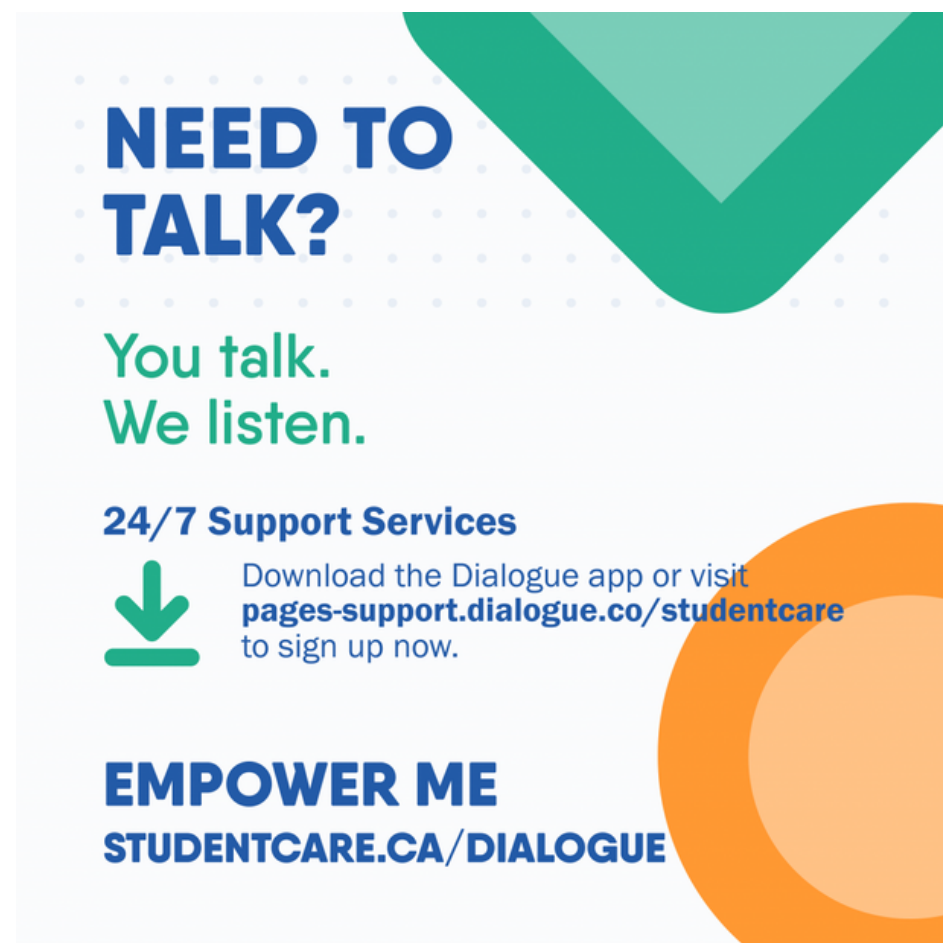
